#### Happy June to everyone!

Congratulations to all the graduates and for all the others for just making it through the school year – to include the parents!

For all the folks that haven't been here through the recent transformation, let me provide a brief introduction. The Housing Authority of Owensboro offers Section 8 Project Based Vouchers (580) and Housing Choice Vouchers (294). This agency completed exiting the Public Housing program in 2022. All the previous public housing apartments are now privately owned through a nonprofit that we control with rent subsidy through the project based voucher program.

I have worked in the housing authority industry for over 29 years in various capacities with the past ten years as Director in Owensboro. The HAO expanded their service portfolio in 2021 to include a property management component, HAO Properties. The team that I am blessed to work with at the HAO includes 28 highly qualified individuals that are professionals in their fields. Our team members also frequently provide training and consulting services for other housing authorities, as well as other property management agencies.

#### **Upcoming Work**

As a result of the hail storm in March, there will be roof replacements throughout the properties along with other repairs.

This will occur over the next few months. Following all the repairs the HAO will look at scheduling upgrades to the apartments in our properties outside of Churchill Park. Each site has a budget set for these repairs and timing will be based on need. The upgrades and schedules will be shared once we have them.

#### Newsletter, YAPP App, & One Call

HAO Properties will share important information in various ways to include the newsletter, YAPP app, and, for time sensitive important information, One-Call. These methods of communication is more effective than the old method of fliers being placed in doors. The newsletter is posted on our website at <a href="https://www.owensborohousing.org">www.owensborohousing.org</a> for you to read.

Please download the YAPP app so you do not miss out on something. The instructions are included in this newsletter. Also make sure you are enrolled in the One-Call system to receive information by voice phone call, text, and/or email. One-Call will be used for time sensitive or emergency situations, so it is very important you enroll to receive the information.

Thanks to Tonette Crite, Resident Services Supervisor, for her work in providing the HAO Properties Newsletter with a new look. All the important information is included but with a facelift.

Remember that if we provide information in the newsletter such as inspections, policy change, or items requiring you to act, you will be held responsible regardless of your choosing to read the newsletter.

# A FEW NOTES TO REMEMBER:

- We have **FREE** bus passes in the front office for Tenants!
- Churchill Park Food Pantry open every Monday
   1:00 PM - 4:00pm

- Large Item Removal on Sunday nights, place items on the city curb (please do not use 4<sup>th</sup> Street). No work order needed. On Mondays that the office is open, HAO Properties will pick up and dispose of items placed. Items left after pick up will incur \$50 charge per worker needed to remove the items.
- Download the YAPP APP to receive HAO Property updates and news to your smartphone! Enter code <u>HAOKY009</u> and sit back and enjoy!
- Vehicles (cars, motorbikes, and mopeds) parked in "permit only" areas without a parking permit will be tagged. Vehicles not properly parked will be tagged. Failure to comply will result in towing at the owner's expense.

#### **INSPECTIONS**

- Conducted 8am 4pm
- Ensure easy access by removing items in way of breaker boxes, windows, closets, furnace room, and air returns in the living
- Clear off top of refrigerator
- Take out all trash
- Yards/decks will be inspected



#### **MAINTENANCE**

- Preventative maintenance continues on HVACs and water heaters - do not block access - during this time water will be unavailable, but tenants do not need to be home for this service to take place
- Maintenance locks apartments after exiting for security reasons
- Tub surrounds at Smith Homes continues
- Maintenance fee will be charged if rereturn due to unkenneled pets or blocked areas

#### Outside Care

Tenants should keep the area around their apartment clean and free of trash, debris, paper, cans, clothing, boxes, bags, cigarette butts, tires, or any other items not specifically allowed. Two lawn chairs can be stored on front porches. Furniture intended for interior cannot be kept on the outside premises.

Tenants should pick up items from their yards and must request approval from management to store other items not specifically outlined.



#### Lawn Care

Mowing Season has begun, and Tenants should keep their yards clean and clear for mowers.

Neither HAO Properties or mowing contractors will be held responsible for damage to items left in yards as they may be removed by HAO Properties' staff to allow the lawn crew to complete work.

Grill (1 per household), bicycles (1 per HH member), and children's riding toys must be stored in the rear of the unit. Front and back doors must be kept unblocked for entry and exit.



#### Housekeeping Inspections

Possible Concerns:

- Trash the size of I large bag in any room or outside (porch/deck)
- Diapers, feces, or urine any type on floor in the more than one place
- Sticky floor due to spills
- Bathroom sink, toilet, and/or shower/tub with dirt, hair, body fluids, feces, hair dye, or nail polish
- Kitchen has more than a day's worth of dishes in sink, stove top and stove, countertops, or refrigerator dirty/greasy or spills
- Excess food in rooms other than kitchen - bug activity

<u>Good</u> = Zero concerns <u>Fair</u> = One concern

**Poor/Failure** = Two or more concerns



# Rent will always be due on the 1st of every month

If the 1st falls on a weekend and the office is closed on the 1st, the Tenant can ensure their rent is paid by make payment online.

HAO provides a grace period of five (5) calendar days before Tenant receives a late strike and a \$30.00 late fee.

If the 5th falls on a weekend or a day the office is closed, HAO allows Tenants to pay rent the following day the office is open without obtaining a late fee/late strike.

Tenants have the ability to mail their rent payment, however, the date on the money order and the postmark date on the envelope must be dated before or on the due date. If the money order is dated before, but the postmark date on the envelope is after the due date, the payment will be marked late and a late strike will be added.
